Greg Campbell is a documentary filmmaker, an award-winning journalist and the author of several nonfiction books, including "**Blood Diamonds**" which was the inspiration for the 2006 film of the same name.

Campbell's directorial debut, the feature-length documentary **HONDROS** -- about the late Getty Images photojournalist Chris Hondros -- had its World Premiere at the *2017 Tribeca Film Festival*, where it won the prestigious **Audience Award**. Campbell also earned a special **jury mention** in the *Best New Director* competition. **HONDROS** was executive produced by Jake Gyllenhaal and Jamie Lee Curtis.

Campbell's work has appeared in the **New York Times, The Guardian, The Economist, The Atlantic, The Daily Beast, The New Republic, USA Today** and many other outlets. In 2015, he was a finalist for a national *Emmy Award* for reporting from Iraq that appeared in the **New York Times**. That work won the *2015 Digiday Publishing Award* for "**Best Use of Video.**"

Campbell is the co-founder and owner of the film production company Fox Tale Films, with offices in Denver and Malmö, Sweden. The company specializes in documentary style video journalism and branded content. Commercial clients have included **Jameson Whiskey, FedEx, Zillow, Molson-Coors, PwC, Mapquest** and others.

Campbell has worked throughout the world, including in Africa, Europe and the Middle East. He is certified for combat medicine through Reporters Instructed in Saving Colleagues.
